### From the Rector's Corner

*Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. Isaiah 41:10*

We live in a world that our ancestors could not have comprehended. And yet, some things are true throughout the ages: fear, disease, economic disaster, loneliness, government upheaval, depression, as well as faith, hope, joy, love, peace, and kindness. How in the world do we hold these two sets of truths not only side by side, but simultaneously in our lives?

It goes without saying that 2020 has been a harsh year for so many people, unlike most of us (but not all of us) have experienced in our lifetimes. We, as a nation, as Christians, as neighbors, as friends, as St James have at times been pushed to the limit. Where will we find relief? How do we find relief? Not even mentioning how we might begin to heal the division and discord brought about by such disruption and disorder.

And then I turn my eyes to God. The One who says, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life." (Matt 6:25). More than one hundred times in Scripture we hear, "fear not," or, "be not afraid." "Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." (Ps 24:3). Twenty-one times in Scripture we hear "I am with you," including the quote above.

God knows we need His word of encouragement, strength, hope, and protection when we are in trouble, and He offers it. But why don't we hear it? Or, why don't we believe it? Or, what is it we fear? Or better yet, then how do I fill my life with faith, hope, joy, love, peace, and kindness no matter what?

There are so many suggestions I could offer – turn to your faith community, engage in Bible study, pray . . . But here are two simple suggestions that you might bring into the new year. First, a gratitude list. Every day, maybe at bedtime when you are saying your prayers, asking forgiveness, and giving thanks, we could be a bit more specific: I give thanks for this bed, warmth, the food that I had today, clean water, safety while I sleep . . .

And the second – make a God jar, box, envelope, or container. With every care, worry, or fear, say a prayer, write down your concern, and put it in the container. Put it in God's hands, and then don't take it back! Yes, we need to take action, but we don't need to be filled with fear and worry while we take the steps we can take to change a situation.

Is life really that simple? I invite you to give it a try and then let me know. Is it easy? I guess not, or we would already be living life without fear or worry. It is a choice we can make, an invitation, God's invitation that we can accept. Fear not . . . I've got you.

### **Bible Study**

**Every Monday at 4:00 (via Zoom)  
will return on Monday, January 4th**

We will continue our study of the Psalms beginning with Psalm 98. Each week we read and study four Psalms. Along with prayer, discussion and reflection we often hear or sing a version of each Psalm. Everyone is invited to join us every Monday at 4 to study Scripture - no previous knowledge necessary or expected, and it is easy to join us as each psalm stands alone.

### **Women's Bible Study Wednesdays at 10:00 (via Zoom)**

Join us on Wednesdays as we continue the study of the Gospel of Mark which we use in Year B (starting Advent 1). We learn some background, history, and geography along with studying the Scripture. Each week we read a Chapter broken into bite-sized pieces, dig a little deeper into the layers of meaning, and then reflect on how the Scripture informs our daily life. All are invited to participate, and you don't need to own a Bible (we will provide one) or know anything about interpreting Scripture.

### **Lenten Series**

#### **Thursdays February 18th through Thursday March 25th at 10:00**

Throughout Lent, beginning on February 17<sup>th</sup> at we will engage in a Lenten Reflection and study using the Archbishop of Canterbury Lenten Book 2021. Every year the Archbishop writes, or commissions someone to write a Lenten book intended for study and reflection during the season of Lent. This year we will read and study together *Living His Story: Revealing the Extraordinary Love of God in Ordinary Ways* by Hannah Steele.

“How can we convey the love of God to our neighbours in a post-Christian world that has largely forgotten the gospel of Jesus Christ?

In *Living His Story*, the Archbishop of

Canterbury’s Lent Book 2021, Hannah Steele uncovers liberating and practical ways of sharing the gospel story afresh. With warmth and encouragement, She shows us how we can live Jesus’ story in our own lives simply by being the people God made us and allowing people to be drawn to him through our natural gifts.

*Living His Story* is a Lent devotional that will change

the way you think about evangelism, show how ideally suited it is for the world we live in and fill you with confidence in sharing God’s love with the people around you. Set out in six sessions to take you through Lent, each chapter of the 2021 Archbishop of Canterbury’s Lent book can be used as a single study for individuals or small groups to prepare for Easter. It will help you find space to see evangelism from a new practical perspective.”

On Thursdays we will pray together, read together, reflect and engage in a discussion each week. You can order a copy through your favorite book dealer, or see Joan to order a copy from Amazon.

The book is available on Kindle \$7.99 and Paperback \$15.00. This book will be released on January 26<sup>th</sup>.

### **Operation Christmas Child – Samaritan's Purse**

Last year St James sent 38 boxes to children around the world! This year we sent 66 boxes! An incredible outpouring of love, and of the gospel message to children around the world. What happened after you delivered your box to Carol, Luanne, Lynne, or submitted it online? Shipping: Thousands of volunteers serve annually inspecting and preparing shoeboxes for international shipping. Every hour work stops for a few minutes to pray for the children who will receive the boxes. Worldwide Distribution: Long before shoeboxes arrive in more than 100 countries, volunteer National Leadership Teams train pastors and community leaders who want to share the message of the Gospel and bless children. The leaders learn how to host child-friendly outreach events, and how to implement The Greatest Journey follow-up discipleship program.

Outreach Events: Pastors around the world host outreach events in places where people may not know Christ and invite them to follow Him. Other churches use the boxes as resources for outreach in orphanages and other at-risk areas. In many places, they also offer The Greatest Gift, a Gospel story booklet Samaritan's Purse developed for shoebox recipients.

### **Fire Protection Monitoring System**

St James has a new fire protection monitoring system! Many thanks to a Fred and Harriet Memorial Foundation grant that is helping to cover a large portion of the cost. The system includes 30+ new devices including smoke, CO<sub>2</sub>, and heat sensors, along with new strobe/siren units, and pull stations. The system components are monitored 24/7 by an alarm company and we will be alerted immediately upon their receiving an alarm from one of the devices. The new system is capable of having the alarm company directly contact 911 once the County has the capability to receive that type of notification.
