## From the Rector's Corner

and to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:8

To all God's beloved who are called to be saints:

Whew – I have been blessed by the love that has surrounded my arrival. You have all been great, showing me the way, asking if I need anything, making sure you remind me of your name, introducing me to the people of Hammondsport. I have been blessed by seeing how you care for each other, how you reach out when there is a need, and how you have let me know when I need to pay someone a visit. I have been blessed in being called to serve you as Rector. Thank you.

The first month has come and gone, and with the changing of the seasons, both liturgically, and earthly, one thing remains clear; together we will continue the everlasting work of the kingdom. Since June 1<sup>st</sup> we have been in Easter season, Pentecost, the Trinity, and have embarked on the green season of Discipleship. The Mission Committee has dispersed new grants, and the Food Pantry is in the process of obtaining their own 501.c.3 status, and we participated in a First Friday Service. Camp Good Days: \$1000 for flood damage
