## From the Rector's Corner

*I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? (Is 43:19a)*  
*And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." (Rev 21:5a)*

Yes, we are entering the year 2016, and yes, it hardly seems possible that another year has gone by so quickly. And yes, the years do go by more quickly . . . But what strikes me this year is the "new" part of New Year. We live in a society where "new" is perceived as better. People line up to get the "new" iphone, or to see the "new" Star Wars movie. We often see old homes and buildings torn down to make room for "new" construction. I can't read the news without seeing, "The new poll shows that Americans . . .," or "New study reveals Americans . . .," or "New research shows . . ." Just when we thought we knew what we wanted, or knew what was good for us, or knew how we were going to vote, something "new" comes along to change our mind again.

It seems there are several basic ways to understand the word "new". New can mean something that had not existed before and now it has been made or discovered or created. Another definition of "new" is something that already exists, but now is seen or experienced in a different way. Scripture invites us to see God working in the world, sometimes creating anew from nothing, or from chaos, and other times God works in us so we have a newness of perception. "A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh." (Ez 36:26) I know there are many days that I pray for that new heart, a heart of flesh that perceives the world through the heart of God.

So maybe this New Year we can shift our focus just a bit from making resolutions we can't keep, or striving to get that new gadget, and turn once again to Jesus Christ. **Renewing** our spiritual practices, digging deeper into the Scriptures, or keeping a journal of the ways that the Holy pops into our awareness and our lives.

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Cor 5:17)

### **Lenten Series**

**Wednesdays February 17<sup>th</sup> – March 16<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m.**

Throughout Lent, beginning on February 17<sup>th</sup> at we will engage in a Lenten Reflection and study using: Lent for Everyone, Luke, Year C by N. T. Wright. As you recall, this is the year of Luke, and we will be reading through this Gospel throughout the year. Lent for Everyone is a daily reflection book that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends the Saturday after Easter, inviting you to read a passage of the Gospel, a short reflection by N. T. Wright, and then a few questions to ponder, or a prayer. I invite you to read along whether you participate in the weekly discussion or not. *I encourage you to have a journal or notepad handy throughout Lent and spend a few minutes each day writing down your reflections and questions.* We will gather to discuss for discussion each week.
