From the Rector's Corner

*From there you will seek the Lord your God,
and you will find him if you search after him with all your heart and soul.
(Deuteronomy 4:19)*

To all God's beloved who are called to be saints:

It seems we are all searching for something or seeking something: love, health, wealth, prestige, happiness, friendship, a sense of belonging. I believe that seeking-searching sense is within each of us, and was placed there by God. For in our deepest hearts, we desire God. But in our day-to-day lives we mistake that hunger and thirst as a longing for material or social connection. In part, that is where we find God, in our everyday interactions with others.

Remember the fun you had when as a group of kids you would create a treasure hunt? Or as part of a youth group you would go on a scavenger hunt? The following generation came up with geocaching, and now we have Pokéman Go. In case you are not familiar, Pokéman go is played on an electronic device. It is a game that you play alone, or with others. There are a lot of parts to this game, but one of the most interesting parts is that you must move in the real world, not from the couch or your room. You must seek and interact with the parts, and the game gets more interesting when you interact with others.

Did you know that St James is a PokéStop? According to imore.com, "PokéStops are important or iconic places around your area: They may be special benches with dedication plaques, permanent art installations, or historic landmarks." PokéStops are visible to all players, and are a crucial part of the game. You see, PokéStops are where you get the essentials, necessary items, the things that let you capture, feed, and grow your collection of critters.

I had several thoughts about that as I was playing the other night. Although St James gets the recognition of being an important site in Hammondsport, many of the people stopping in front of our building don't know what other essential items they can obtain at St James. We offer a story that creates, feeds, and sustains all of humanity and all of creation. We offer community and fellowship. We offer a place to find peace, solace, and strength in times of need. We offer a place filled with the Spirit, and people who are alive with song and prayer. We care deeply about each other and the world

around us. We have opportunities to connect and build a relationship with Jesus Christ, who freely gives us food for the journey, and eternal life.

I smile as I see groups of teens, youth, and adults gathering at our front steps seeking tools for the Pokéman Go game. Someday, I hope and pray, they will look up and wonder. Wonder what is behind those doors that offers more than a hand-held device and fictional characters can provide.

In the meantime, I give thanks. Thanks for the many ways our community is growing both in word and deed; growing numerically, spiritually, and missionally. I give thanks for the eternal story that is in the bones of the building, and more importantly, in our daily lives.

For the last two years St James has participated in the CROP Walk and helped raise funds for the Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry at St James. Stewardship Carl the Complainer

Carl the Complainer was unhappy.

He had just returned from the worship service at Christ the Redeemer Church where he had generously placed a \$5.00 bill in the offering plate but only received a small piece of bread and a sip of wine in return. The following Sunday he went to the local bakery and was able to purchase an entire loaf of bread and a small orange juice for \$5.00. “Fools for Christ!” he was heard to exclaim. And so for the next few years, Carl the complainer used his money to purchase bread and juice at the bakery rather than “wasting it” at the church. He often reminded himself and others of the better deal he was getting.

One day Carl found himself in the hospital facing a serious illness. He complained about many things, including the awkward visit the pastor of the church made, since neither he nor Carl were well acquainted. You might be surprised that the pastor visited since Carl was not a church attendee, but we don’t buy such visits by our offerings. Most pastors will visit whether you complain about them or not.

But the real cost to Carl came when Jesus showed up at the hospital and Carl knew it not. How you choose to spend your money has everlasting significance: not by buying your way into Jesus’ heart but by beginning and building upon a relationship that makes all the difference, on earth as it is in heaven. A relationship with Jesus is what matters most and it this relationship that we build upon through our church attendance, prayers, service, and offerings.

By not knowing this, Carl missed the boat and true to form, he complained about it. He also complained that the owner of the bakery did not visit him in the hospital...but, then, what can you expect for only \$5.00 a week?
