IT WAS TRADITIONALLY A DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE WHERE THE PRIEST, IN VIOLET VESTMENTS WOULD GO OUT TO A FARMER'S FIELDS TO BLESS THE CROPS. NOWADAYS WE CALL IT A PRAYER WALK, AND GATHER TOGETHER WITH OTHER FAITH COMMUNITIES TO WALK THE BOUNDARIES OF OUR COMMUNITY. WE WILL STOP FOR PRAYER AT A VARIETY OF LOCATIONS INCLUDING BUSINESS, INDUSTRY, SCHOOL, FIELD, WATER, AND HOMES TO ASK GOD'S BLESSINGS UPON OUR COMMUNITY. EVERYONE IS WELCOME TO PARTICIPATE, AND MORE INFORMATION WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE WEEKS TO COME.

You will process in front of the other gifts and hand them to the Acolyte.
