From Mother C

If everything we have planned comes to fruition, we have a wonderful year ahead of us. First of all, Gregg Learned has been in conversation with Peckham and Son regarding the installation of the sixteen foot reed pipes for our organ. We hope to start this project in June, and when completed, it will add incredible richness to the sound of the organ.

Second, we started the huge project of painting the church - inside and out - last year, and it should be completed this spring. Even the interior of the bell tower will be painted. All this painting, and the repair of all the cracks and rough places, makes the church look regenerated, clean and new. This project was made possible by a gift Walter and Linda Carl had made to the Preservation Fund.

We are aware that our elevator is in need of some serious help. We are presently in the process of repair. We were concerned that we might have to replace the elevator, but it is beginning to look as though it might be able to be repaired. Whichever we have to do, our goal is to complete this as soon as possible so it will be available to people who have need of it.

And the most exciting of all... A couple years ago we started a capital campaign to renovate the Undercroft of the church. When we originally began, we hoped we could do this work for fifty thousand dollars. Soon we realized that it was going to cost far more than that -- so -- we kept saving for this project. With the generosity of the people of St. James, the Taylor Foundation, the Mercury Aircraft Foundation, the Meade Foundation and memorials over the past couple years, we had been able to raise \$100,000, but it was still not enough. Then, last fall, we were blessed with an incredible gift of \$50,000 from the Lawrence Family Foundation. This was given in memory of Flora Taylor Keeler, mother of Mary Lawrence and grandmother of John Lawrence. The generosity of the Lawrence Family Foundation's gift has made it possible for us to actually begin this project in 2009.

I know you are aware that a Renovation Committee has been working for you. The recordings of suggestions from the committee, and the congregation were posted on the wall of the Undercroft for a couple months, and you were given additional time to add your comments and thoughts. All these suggestions have been recorded and passed on to architect, Marsha Meade Coon. Bruce White has completed a "footprint" drawing of the Undercroft which has also been passed on to Marsha. We should be meeting with Marsha in a couple weeks to begin the process.

As I said, if everything we have planned comes to fruition, we have a busy, but wonderful, year ahead of us.

VESTRY NOTES

- Jim Grillo, Ted Dykas, Leah Nichiporuk and Karen Derr will prepare the audit for 2008.
- The Rev. Curtis said that the funds for her health insurance, which the school system has been paying, will run out in the fall, and she is asking the Vestry to pick up her half.
- Requests came in from Children's International for a donation. The Vestry voted last year to send a lump sum. We will do the same this year.
- Mary White and Leah Nichiporuk will prepare the request for the Taylor Foundation for 2009.
- Established a Capital Improvement Fund for repair and replacement of the elevator.
- Accepted a gift of \$1,000 from the Meade Foundation and put it in the Elevator Capital Improvement Fund. A thank you letter has been sent to the Meade Foundation for the \$1,000 they gave St. James.
- Accepted a gift of \$6,000 from the Mercury Aircraft Foundation and placed it in the Elevator Capital Improvement Fund. A thank you letter has been sent to the Mercury Aircraft Foundation for the \$6,000 donation they gave St. James.
- Transferred \$185.00 to the Organ fund to remove the \$185.00 deficit in that fund.
- Transferred \$73.75 from the Net Interest Account to the Building Fund.
- Gregg Learned is in contact with Peckham & Son regarding the organ pipes. It appears the work for the new rank of pipes will begin in June.
- Discussion took place regarding painting the bell tower and the elevator shaft, and it was decided to wait and include it in the discussions regarding the renovation of the Undercroft.
- Bruce White has met with Marsha Coon, our architect for the Renovation Project, regarding the Footprint of the church which will be put on CAD.
- Discussion took place regarding whether to discontinue the use of the bulletin insert and use the Bibles in the pews. No decision was made.

Lenten Program

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 25, 2009. There will be three services that day at which you can receive Ashes. There will be the Ash Wednesday Liturgy with Holy Communion at 7:00 AM, a 12:00 noon Ecumenical Service and Luncheon at the Methodist Church, and the Ash Wednesday Liturgy with Holy Communion at 7:00 PM. It is hoped that everyone will be able to attend one of these services.

Ash Wednesday begins the Ecumenical Lenten Program. Every Wednesday during Lent, you are invited to attend a 12:00 noon service and luncheon at one of our local churches. St. James will be the host church on March 18. Please check your calendar for the location of the service each week.

We will also have an evening Lenten Program in the Undercroft of the church on Tuesdays - March 10, 17, 24, 31.
