Our “Organ and Piano Concert and Hymn Sing” was held at St. James' Church on August 29 at 300 P.M. The concert featured area organists who each presented a recital piece and finished with the congregation singing their favorite hymns. A reception followed in the Flora Taylor Keeler Room. It was a wonderful afternoon for all who attended. Thank you, Ellie Boutwell, for arranging this concert for us.

Recently Gregg Learned reported to the Vestry concerning the last rank of Pipes for our organ. Gregg, Ellie Boutwell and Mary Jane Burch, had discussed with Peckham and Son the needs of our organ; it was decided that our organ needs 16' VIOLINE pipes. The estimated cost of the new pipes is \$16,400, which we have saved. We are awaiting the official contract for the work from Peckham and Son. We understand that even though the work is being done to the organ, we will be able to use the instrument for Sunday services. We all look forward to this new addition to the organ, which will make the sound richer, and we look forward to this project being completed.

On July 31, we gathered at Pete and Connie Manika's home on Keuka Lake for a delicious cook-out. It was a chance to say thank you to everyone who helped with the renovation of the undercroft. It didn't matter if you managed the project like Nick Forenz, or were the contractor like Tom Pietsch, or the de-structor like Richard Frey, or the painter like Doug Frey, or the ceiling measurer like Bob Hunn, or jack of all trades like Floyd French and Tom Bidwell, or you varnished, tore down plaster, took up tiles, carried junk to the dumpster, painted doors, scrubbed stainless steel, swept the floors, checked out the paint samples, held ladders or wires, and on, and on, and on; you were invited to come and help celebrate. We feasted on barbecued chicken and pulled pork, salads, and desserts. We presented Nick Forenz, our Project Manager, with his own personal “Golden Hammer,” for the project, and a good time was had by all.
