

The bell restoration is complete. After thirty years of silence the bell was rung on Sunday, February 25, 2024 to call us to worship. The new bell is glorious indeed, singing the same spectacular voice as it first did in 1895! The clock is set to strike with the new tolling hammer once, on the hour, Monday – Sunday, 6am – 10:00pm: The tone is warm and mellow and can be heard throughout the village well down to the lake. The ‘swinging’ voice (from the clapper inside the bell) is much louder and brighter, as it should be for the Call to Worship and celebratory events. **Three Cheers and many thanks to Marilyn Dowdle for leading this wonderful project!** Gregg Learned will be offering a quick “Bell Ringers ‘tutorial’ after service for the next several Sundays for anyone who wants to try their hand at swinging 2000lbs of harmonious bronze.

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

FEBRUARY 15, 2024

- The bell restoration was funded by two donations, \$10,000 from the Meade Foundation and \$14,000 from the Mercury Aircraft.
- Richard Little has been elected to the Diocese Standing Committee.



Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah

Author – William Williams, 1717 – 1791

Composer – John Hughes, 1873 – 1932

For Thou art my rock and my fortress; therefore for Thy name's sake lead me, and guide me.

Psalm 31:3

'Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah' first appeared in a hymnal in 1745. It originally was entitled 'Strength to Pass Through the Wilderness.' The imagery of the hymn is drawn wholly from the Bible. The hymn compares the forty-year journey of the Israelites to the promised land with the living of a Christian life as a 'pilgrimage through this barren land. Note the symbolic phrases used throughout: 'bread of heaven' (manna), 'crystal fountain' (Corinthians 10:3, 4), 'fire and cloudy pillar,' verge of Jordan, 'Canaan's side.'



From Lesser Feasts and Fasts

On March 17 we honor St. Patrick
Bishop of Ireland, 461



Patrick was born into a Christian family somewhere on the northwest coast of Britain in about 390. His grandfather had been a Christian priest and his father a deacon. His father was an important official in the late Roman imperial government of Britain.

When Patrick was about sixteen, he was captured by a band of Irish slave-raiders. When he was about twenty-one he escaped and returned to Britain, where he was educated as a Christian.

Tradition holds that Patrick returned to Ireland in about year 431 near the place of his earlier captivity. He began a remarkable process of missionary conversion throughout the country that continued until his death. Patrick erected Christian churches over sites already regarded as sacred.

Many legends of Patrick's Irish missionary travel possess substrata of truth, especially those telling of his conversion of the three major Irish High Kings. At Armagh, he is said to have established his principal church. To this day, Armagh is regarded as the primatial see of all Ireland.

Let Us Pray:


