


From St. James' With Love June 2024 Newsletter



In Christ There is no East or West

Tune Name - "St. Peter"


Scripture Reference: Galations 3:28

John Oxemham was born in Manchester, England, on November 12, 1852. His real name was William Arthur Dunkerly. He ran a successful wholesale grocery company with branches in Europe and the United States. Under the pen name Julian Ross he wrote fictional serial stories in a newspaper. Under the pen name John Oxenham, which was a pseudonym borrowed from *Western Ho!* a book given to him by his Sunday School teacher, he wrote many best-selling poems and hymns. It is said that he published more than forty novels and twenty other volumes of verse and prose.

An intesting account is told of an incident during World War II in which there were two ships anchored together, one containing Japanese aliens and the other American aliens, waiting to be repatriated. For one day they lined the rails glaring at each other. Suddenly, someone began to sing "In Christ There is No East or West." Then another, on the opposite ship, joined in. Soon there was an extraordinary chorus of former enemies praising God together.

From Lesser Feasts and Fasts



Justin was born to a Greek speaking pagan family about the year 110 in Samaria, near Shechem. He was educated in Greek philosophy. Like Agustine after him he was left restless by all this knowledge. During a walk along the beach at Ephesus, he fell in with a stranger, who told him about Christ. "Straightway a flame was kindled in my soul," he writes, "and a love of the prophets and those who are friends of Christ possessed me." He became a Christian as a result of this encounter, and thereafter regarded Christianity as the only "safe and profitable philosophy."

About 150, Justin moved to Rome. While teaching in Rome, he engaged in a public debate with a philosopher of the Cinic school named Crescens, accusing him of ignorance and immorality. Angered, Crescens preferred legal charges before the prefect Rusticus. Rusticus gave Justin and his followers the opportunity to renounce their faith. All steadfastly refused. Justin and his companions were put to death about the year 167.

Let Us Pray: Almighty and everlasting God, you found your martyr Justin wandering from teacher to teacher, seeking the true God, and you revealed to him the sublime wisdom of your eternal Word: Grant that all who seek you, or a deeper knowledge of you, may find and be found by you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever, *Amen*
