First Friday Fellowship




Hi Everybody!

Saint James Church Window



If you look closely, you can see a pelican. The pelican is a symbol of the Atonement. She is shown piercing her own breast and feeding her young with her blood. This also rests on the ancient legend that in times of famine the mother pelican would tear open her breast, giving her life for her young. Sometimes a serpent is shown with the pelican, referring to a variation in the story that a serpent stings the young and the mother revives them with her own blood.
