They will get to visit Daniel and his friends and collect bible memory makers to remind the kids of our God's word. Everyone will get to look for evidence of God all around them through something we call God sightings. Each day will end in a celebration with upbeat worship that gets everyone involved.

Kids at Babylon will join more than a million participants reaching out to world vision through a mission project called Operation Kid to Kid. This mission raises money to provide Bibles to children around the world in their own language. We will also provide items of need to our local Loaves and Fishes food pantry.

Babylon VBS will run from 9am to noon and lunch will be provided by Hammondsport School District. Volunteers positions needed include: Crew Leaders-taking children to their stations and teaching valuable lessons to children who will carry these Bible truths for a lifetime.

Marketplace-helping children with fun filled crafts from back in the time in Babylon.

Local churches are being asked to donate \$250 to put toward expenses of this program if it is at all possible. The money is being used to purchase curriculum, craft supplies, decorations, and special items for the children to take home to remember God's truth. Volunteers are needed from 8:30 to noon each day.
