From the Rector's Corner

O taste and see that the LORD is good; happy are those who take refuge in him. (Psalm 34:8)

We are in the last days of August and once again I was halted as I reached home, not that late, but after dark. A month ago in the evening the sun was still shining when I arrived home after the Book Group. As I paused for a moment outside my door I noticed that the air was a bit chilly, and some leaves were starting to fall in the back yard. The neighbor's pumpkins look full sized, although they will keep growing for another few weeks. I said a quick prayer as I heard the small skein of geese honking their way south get ready to settle in for the night. Where do the days go? Where do the years go?

For the past five weeks the Gospel lessons have come from John 6 – Jesus as the bread of life; eat the flesh and drink the blood and you will live forever, or you will abide in Jesus and he will abide in you. Week after week we heard the invitation to set all else aside and sink our teeth into the mystery and magnificence of God. Sunday after Sunday we were invited to commit all that we have and all that we are to the incarnate God. Abide – pause – reflect – listen – fast – pray – linger – dwell in the presence of the Holy One. Yet, our lives are so full and so busy that it is hard to give the invitation more than a passing thought on a Sunday morning.

As the days grow shorter, the night grows longer, and our youngsters return to school, I invite you to take a moment and reflect on where God might be calling you into a deeper relationship. Might it be through giving of your time and talent on Sunday mornings in the choir, as an usher, or a reader? It might be by joining the Bible Study or Book Group? Maybe through volunteering at the Chicken and Biscuit dinner, or the CROP Walk. Or are you being invited to spend more time in reading Scripture, or in personal prayer.

During September and October we continue in "Ordinary Time", the time after Pentecost and leading up to the new church year in Advent. Ordinary Time is a time of discipleship, learning how we can deepen our faith life and our commitment to following in Jesus' footsteps. May this be a productive time in your life that leads to a fruitful harvest.


All Saints' Day

Our Vision Statement is: God asks us to make His love visible in our lives and community. . . . let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. (1 John 3:18)

We are focusing several aspects of evangelism:

- The Vestry has made a financial commitment to Evangelism and the growth of St James by authorizing the creation of a restricted Evangelism fund.
- Pew racks have been placed in every pew with a brochure and welcome card.
- We were “Open” for three Village events, offered tours, and gave free water to visitors.
- We include a prayer for parish growth in our weekly Prayers of the People
- St James is “**Open for Prayer**” on **Thursdays from 10:00 – 2:00**, with a brief noonday Healing Eucharist that features the saint of the day.

Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry

The Pantry gives thanks for the **weekly** basket of food and other items. They would like to remind us that cleaning products, and hygiene products (toothpaste, deodorant...) are always needed as well as the food items.



Backpack Program

Many thanks to you all for helping to collect, pack, and distribute backpacks and school supplies to more than 40 Hammondsporf School students. This is a great way for us to show our support to our children and youth as they return for another academic year.
