

#### **An Empty Cup**

I recently received a beautifully handmade ceramic cup from my seventeen-year-old granddaughter, Rowen. I vividly remember placing the cup on my desk and noticing etched into its bottom was a perfectly shaped heart. My eyes teared up when I saw the engraving.

Knowing Rowen, she may unknowingly, or most likely knowingly, be silently saying to me: when my hollow self appears and feels empty, I know my soul is preparing itself to be filled with love.

The cup reminds me of her vibrant thirst for acceptance and love. She, like many teens are beautiful, vulnerable gentle souls just beginning to unfold themselves to the mysterious world that lays before them.

Her cup with all its beauty is a reminder that even an ordinary and simple clay vessel can be transformed into a spiritual aid in which we can see life with all its emptiness, fullness, brokenness, flaws and blessings.

It is a reminder we cannot always expect our lives to be full. Life includes some emptiness and some pouring out. Her cup is a symbol that in our prayer life we are able to make room for the new. Our spiritual life is like a cup that is in a constant process of emptying and filling, giving and receiving, and accepting and letting go.

Rowen's cup points to our spiritual journey toward oneness with God which is the foundation of our lives. This journey toward God is about change that begins with an empty and vulnerable heart in the presence of the living God. This feeling of emptiness that often overcomes us is not a loss but a preparing that fills us with God's love.

# **Hymn Stories**

#### "A Mighty Fortress Is our God"

Martin Luther was born November 10, 1483. On October 31, 1517, he nailed his ninety-five theses to the door of the Cathedral of Wittenberg Germany. He was excommunicated from the fellowship of the Roman Catholic church in 1520.

One of the benefits of the Reformation Movement was the rediscovery of congregational singing. Martin Luther had strong convictions in the power of sacred music.

The single most powerful hymn of the Protestant Reformation Movement was Luther's "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." Based on Psalm 46. This hymn became the battle cry of the people, a great source of strength and inspiration during a time of uncertainty and conflict. This hymn has been translated into practically every known

language and is regarded as one of the noblest and most classic examples of Christian hymnody.

# October 4th, we celebrate St Francis of Assisi

Francis, the son of a prosperous merchant of Assisi, was born in 1182. His early youth was spent in revelry and fruitless attempts to win military glory. Various encounters with beggars and lepers pricked his conscience, and he decided to embrace a life devoted to Lady Poverty despite his father's intense opposition. In 1210 pope Innocent the Third confirmed the simple rule for the Order of Friars Minor, a name Francis chose to emphasize his desire to be numbered among the "least" of God's servants.

Most high, omnipotent, good Lord, grant your people grace to renounce gladly the vanities of this world; that, following the way of the blessed Francis, we may for love your whole creation with perfect joy. We ask for this through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
